The comprehensive Munich conference program spotlighted discussions about improving the business reporting process for companies of *all* sizes.

U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) Kathleen Casey, IASB Board Member Robert Garnett and other European regulators addressed business leaders from around the world on how listed companies can leverage XBRL to submit regulatory filings accurately, efficiently, quickly and consistently.
